Career Class PATHWAYS Introduced at DMS

We are very excited to introduce a new elective class being taught this year to our 7th grade class: Pathways. Pathways was designed to teach students college and career readiness curriculum, while supporting the World's Best Workforce initiative passed by the state in 2013. The intention behind World's Best Workforce is to close the achievement gap and to ensure that all students are college and career ready as well as graduate from high school by giving students opportunities to take career interest inventories, to explore post-secondary options, and to be taught job employability skills.

At the beginning of the class, each student will create their own career portfolio using the Minnesota Career Information System (MCIS). Students will use their portfolio in order to save information regarding career interests, short and long-term goals, and personality characteristics. The curriculum focuses on key content from MCIS as well as other important life skills. Some highlights of the class include:

- Career Interest Inventory
- SMART Goal Writing
- Qualities for Success
- Job Shadow
- 4-Year Planning for High School
- Resume Writing
- Personal Finance
- Basic Living Skills

We hope that each student will enjoy learning about themselves and how their unique individual personalities shape their career interests, the goals that they set, and the decisions that they make.
