Reading is Alive and Well at DMS!

More than 220 students participated in this year's Battle of the Books program at the Delano Elementary and Middle School. This was an all time participation record for this event, which has been around for more than 10 years. Students in grades 3-8 may participate in this annual reading competition. Students form their own team of three, read books from an assigned list over a two month period, and prepare for the contest. The Battle of the Books contest is set up like a game show. A question is read and each team writes their answers on a white board and holds them up for the judges during a predetermined time period. Each team earns points for correct answers. Students are required to remember details from their books and be able to identify which book the details can be found. It is an exciting event that gets students reading genres they may not normally choose on their own. Battle of the Books also allows students to collaborate with others to prepare for the contest and just have some plain reading fun!

History Day 2017

National History Day competition is open to any student in grades 6-12, but is a required assignment for students in the advanced language arts classes at Delano Middle School. Students work for 3-4 months researching and developing their projects around a central theme and then choose a final product to highlight their knowledge of their topic. Throughout their preparation, students learn to conduct in-depth research, use primary and secondary sources, read a variety of texts, analyze and synthesize information and write and present historical content. Students can choose between an exhibit, documentary, performance or website.

This year's theme, "Taking a Stand in History," was the inspiration for such topics as the Salem Witch Trials, Amber Alert, Helen Keller, The 1980 Olympic Boycotts and Jane Goodall to name a few. The National History Day office chooses a theme to help students direct their research to show a connection between the theme and their topics. The themes that are chosen are broad, allowing students to research topics on all levels from local history to ancient history.

Projects selected to advance to the regional competition will display their work at Mankato State University on Tuesday, March 28.

Txt4Life Regional Coordinator Visits DMS Health Classes

"A person's response to emotional and mental health difficulties is as unique as the person. When a person is moving toward, or has reached the point of crisis, it is time to reach out for help from a crisis resource such as Txt4Life."



We are fortunate to have a new mental health and suicide prevention resource available for our students this school year called Txt4Life, which is a texting program created to help prevent suicide among youth. Suicide is the second leading cause of death among youth and young adults in Minnesota according to the Center for Disease Control, 2014. Txt4Life caters to youth in grades 7-12. It is a free, confidential counseling program where youth can text the line to talk with trained counselors about a variety of mental health concerns. During the 2016-17 school year, Molly

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Wiemann, the Txt4Life Central Minnesota Regional Coordinator, has visited 8th grade health classes to speak about Txt4Life. Molly visits schools throughout central Minnesota to educate students about suicide prevention. She provides students with information about how to access Txt4Life if needed. Students are typically hesitant to talk face-to-face with others or to call a hotline when they are experiencing a mental health crisis. This is why we feel it is essential for them to learn about Txt4Life. If you would like more information about Txt4Life, please visit http://txt4life.org/.
