







DMS School Climate Survey

Greetings DMS Families,

The Delano Middle School Site Base Leadership Team (SBLT), consisting of administrators, teachers, school board representatives, and parents recognizes a school's climate as an integral part of a student's educational experience. A positive school climate is essential for promoting student achievement and developing the personal characteristics we wish to instill in our students. Over the past several years, we have not utilized a formal process for assessing the climate at DMS. As such, the SBLT included the development of a school climate assessment tool and the collection of baseline data as one of our goals for the year. This was approved by the Board of Education in October.



This spring, all students, staff, and parents will have the opportunity to participate in a survey process that will give our SBLT baseline information as to the state of the climate at DMS. Students will take the survey in their language arts classes on May 11. The survey, and all questions included, are anonymous and optional. Students will use their school-provided Google login to access the survey. This is only needed to maintain the security of the information and **WILL NOT** be used to track student responses.

Any parent/guardian who wishes to view a copy of the survey prior to distribution is welcome to do so. Copies will be available in the DMS office up to the date of the survey. Parents will receive an invitation to take their version of the survey at the same time as students. The parents survey link will be live for one week.

The SBLT would like to thank you, in advance, for your participation and look forward to getting the results so that we can work together to create the most positive and conducive learning environment for students at DMS. Please feel free to contact me with any questions.

What are Your Kids Watching?

Delano Middle School is committed to supporting the social, emotional, and mental health needs of all students. As such, we want to remind parents and guardians to be aware of television programs and movie selections that your children are choosing and continue to monitor your child's social media accounts and activity on the internet. With television viewing now available and accessible on any mobile device or



laptop, being aware of what your child is watching is more challenging than it used to be. Oftentimes, students are streaming shows by themselves or with other teens present, and some are sharing Netflix IDs and passwords with friends so they can access online content.

We want to remind students that while all of us experience challenges, there are adults who care and can provide support to make it through difficult times in life. Stigma can be a barrier to reaching out to others. Please consider taking this opportunity to engage in conversations with your child about the supportive adults in their life and help to end the stigma of talking about mental health. Reassure your child that talking openly and honestly about emotional distress (their own or a friend's) with a trusted adult is always okay and encouraged.

Please know that all DMS teachers, administrators, and the school social worker are always willing to listen and able to provide support and guidance to all students.

History Day Projects Rise to the Occasion






Regional History Day Participants
