It is a program to help identify sub strand areas in reading, math and science from the MCA results using the Learner Locator Number assigned to the student in the MCA results letter that was mailed to parents in late August. The many online resources can help pinpoint and practice areas of needed improvement such as literature or inferencing in reading texts or probability and number sense in math, etc. A similar program called *Write-to-Learn* will also be available to help teachers and parents develop their students' writing skills. Look for more information on the middle school website under the "Testing" tab. A follow up letter and helpful user/parent guide will be available by mid-October.
