Facilities Committee Works Toward Recommendation

In the last district newsletter I shared information with you regarding the formation of the Delano Public Schools Facilities Committee. At this time, I would like to update you on the progress that has been made thus far regarding the work of the committee. We have reviewed all baseline data regarding our facilities and program needs. We have also established an extensive list of our facility needs and have narrowed the focus on common themes regarding the needs of our facilities for the next 10 years, and established criteria to meet those requirements. Common themes that have been discussed are:

- Addressing capacity/space issues.
- Security; in particular our school entrances.
- Athletic and Performing Arts needs.
- Meeting technology needs in an educational setting.
- Maintaining the physical needs of our current buildings.

We will continue to develop preliminary diagrams of options to consider as solutions to our facility needs. We will then refine these options based on the criteria and make a recommendation to the school board with regards to a final option. The committee will also develop a recommended timeline for implementation of facility options.

Delano Community Education Implements Minnesota Reading Corps in Pre-K Programs

Research has shown that children need to know 10,000 to 12,000 words to be successful readers. Delano Community Education is excited to implement the Minnesota Reading Corps (MRC)/SEEDS of Early Literacy methods in our

Wee Tiger Preschool and Tiger Kids Club Pre-K classrooms this year. This program is built around the "Big 5" learning opportunities: Conversation and Oral Language, Alphabetic Knowledge, Book and Print Rules, Phonological Awareness, and Vocabulary and Meaning.

During the 2013-14 school year, Delano Community Education served as a "comparison site" for a study done to measure the effectiveness of the Minnesota Reading Corps (MRC) pre-K program.

Community Education Director Diane Johnson expressed, "The study, which examined 26 MRC sites and 26 comparison sites in Minnesota,

showed very significant differences between the MRC sites and the comparison sites in five foundational areas for reading preparation. The MRC sites reached the kindergarten readiness benchmark in all five areas, which are picture naming, letter naming, rhyming, letter sounds, and alliteration. The control sites, while showing improvement in all the areas, only reached the kindergarten readiness benchmark in the area of letter naming.

ECFE Program Manager Jane Shaffer said, "We were excited to be selected as an MRC site this year. Five of our teachers have received intensive training and all of our pre-K staff completed SEEDS of Early Literacy training. In addition, we have two part-time "MRC Community Corps" members who assist in our programs.

Our teachers are very enthusiastic about the impact these changes are having on our students already.

Tiger Kids Club teacher Mrs. Hall stated, "The impact of MRC has been great so far this year. My students have become more aware of print and understanding what words mean within a story. They are writing vocabulary words and love to sing the rhyming song. What my students like the most is *Think, Pair, Share*. This is when

they pair up with another child after I have given them a topic using one of our vocabulary words and they share a story."

Wee Tiger teacher Ms. Power shared, "My kids are three months ahead of where they were last year, and ten of them just turned

three years old this summer. Their vocabulary has grown immensely. They are relating the words from the book to real life."

Wee Tiger teacher Mrs. Brasket expressed, "The kids love the vocabulary words and it seems one of their greatest joys is to beat me at the rapid flip thru of all the words. While we taught vocabulary in the past, MRC makes things different - we do "repetitive reading" - reading the same book for a week. The children learn about 15 new words per week, so they have learned well over 100 words so far this year."

Judy Reed who is both a preschool parent and one of our MRC Community Corps members stated, "My child's vocabulary has expanded and he tells me what the words mean. He understands the difference between rhyming and alliteration. He recognizes the vocabulary words in other places, like at the grocery store."

Children are assessed in the fall, winter, and spring in each of the five foundational areas. We are excited to see the results next spring, as our "graduating" students leave us well prepared.

WE Day Shifts World Focus from "Me" to "We"


