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Delano Public Schools Seeks Facilities Committee Members

Delano Public Schools is seeking community members, parents, and staff members to participate on a district wide facilities committee. The purpose of the committee will be to review the current and future needs of our facilities, establish criteria to meet those current and future needs, and propose one to two solutions to meet our facility needs for the next 10 years. Over the past five months the district has compiled data that includes, but is not limited to, demographic studies, capacity analysis for each building, and both internal and external feedback sessions. We are now at a point in this process that we need to establish a facilities committee that will meet six times beginning Thursday, October 23 and ending December 11, 2014. The role of our committee members will be to:



- Represent the entire community
- Engage in conversation with neighbors and peers
- Bring back a broad understanding of opinions
- Review the data being presented to familiarize themselves with the facility needs of the district
- Engage in the process to help determine and prioritize district needs, and consider options to address those needs
- · Reach consensus on a recommended approach for consideration of the school board

Either in December or early January, the school board will review recommendations from our facilities committee and make appropriate decisions regarding the future needs in our district. It takes a community to sustain educational excellence as our foremost goal, and therefore we invite you to consider serving on this all-important committee.

Delano Public Schools 2014 Test Scores Shatter State Proficiency Rates

Standardized tests continue to be a hot debate in school districts across the nation. We want our children to "think outside the box", be creative, and learn more than the information that they are going to be tested on. Delano School educators undertand this and try to balance this conflict in their curriculum and teaching strategies. Yet, among this balance, the core subjects of Math, English, and Science are vitally important in our ever-changing global society. And, test scores, specifically the ACT and SAT, are still one of the methods post secondary insitutions use to admit students.

Delano Public Schools are proud to annouce that students achieved high marks in all areas of testing during the 2013-14 school year. The Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCA) tests are the primary assessment tool used by the State Department of Education. This test has four achievement levels to which students are labeled after looking at the results of each test. Students who fall into the Meets or Exceeds categories are considered to be proficient and making satisfactory progress in meeting the state expectations according to the standards in each discipline.

The Minnesota Department of Education recently released results from the 2014 Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCA) tests. Delano Public Schools continues to score well above the state average in all areas of testing. In **Math**, Delano students performed in the top 1% of public school districts in the state, with only three schools scoring higher on MCA Math tests. 82% of Delano students were proficient on the Math test in comparison with 62% statewide. In **Reading**, Delano students performed in the top 3% of public school districts in the state, with only seven schools scoring higher on the MCA Reading tests. 76% of Delano students were proficient on the Reading test in comparison with 60% statewide. In **Science**, students in 5th, 8th and 11th grade also performed above state averages on this test.

Delano students continue to accomplish high scores on **ACT** college entrance exams as well. Delano's average ACT test score was 24.2 during the 2013-14 school year, making Delano one of the top schools in the nation academically. Minnesota's average ACT score for the 2013-14 school year was 22.9. As a whole Minnesota continues to be one of the nation's leaders in ACT scores.

Although school test scores always seem to make the headlines, Delano Public Schools continue to stress individuality and creativity, while teaching the embedded standards set on the state and national levels. It is the development of th "whole" student that helps pave a path for their future.

Delano Public Schools Strives to Provide Effective, Efficient Communication to Parents and Community

Communicating to our parents and community-at-large is a top priority for the Delano Public School District. We have several different tools we use to share important information about the students and activities that take place on our school campus. And some of them have been modified over the summer months to enhance the means of communication you receive from Delano Public Schools. Here are just a few updates:

Mobile Friendly Website - Delano Schools launched a NEW mobile-friendly website this summer. Much of our school community want to find their student's information while they are on the go. This new site is responsive, which means that it is viewable on any device, from mobile phones and tablets to desktop computers. New features include a search function, a district newsfeed, and a live district calendar. Now, in any format, you can find your student's information anywhere you want.

Skylert Parent Communication System - This NEW parent communication system is integrated with Delano Schools Skyward Family Access Parent Portal so a family's information is always current. Skylert can send thousands of messages within minutes, which helps us alert parents of early school closings, emergency situations, or general school information.

Skyward Family Access Parent Portal - Delano Public Schools Family Access student information management system is designed to provide timely information to parents. This system allows parents to access their student's personal and academic information online. In addition, parents can update personal information, such as email addresses and phone numbers. Features are continually being added to suit parents' needs.

School Meals Federal Food Guidelines Update

The health of today's school environment continues to improve and with this comes new, required federal food guidelines for the 2014-15 school year. Students across the country are now offered healthier school breakfasts and lunches with more fruits, vegetables and whole grains. These standards, required by the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010, want to help curtail hunger, while providing healthy food choices for students. The following requirements have been added for this school year:

- All kindergarten students can eat breakfast at no cost.
- Students eligible for "reduced-price" meals, will now get them for <u>free</u>. Minnesota is one of the few states that will offer this - meals are either paid or free, there is no longer "free and reduced."
- All snacks sold during the school day to students via a la carte, school stores, vending and fundraisers must meet the new Smart Snack nutrition regulations. For more information on these regulatons, go to http://www.regulations.gov.
- All grain items on breakfast, lunch and snack menus must be "whole-grain rich."

Just a few years ago, food service staff did not have to provide planned portions, count calories or analyze the nutrients of each meal to follow daily and weekly nutritional requirements. For school districts, finding acceptable food choices and keeping costs low is a balancing act and labor intensive. To meet these guidelines, Delano Public Schools have had to raise meal prices over the past few years. In the end, our goal is to provide students healthy meal choices, while keeping costs low and limiting the amount of food that is thrown away.


National Merit Semifinalist Announced
